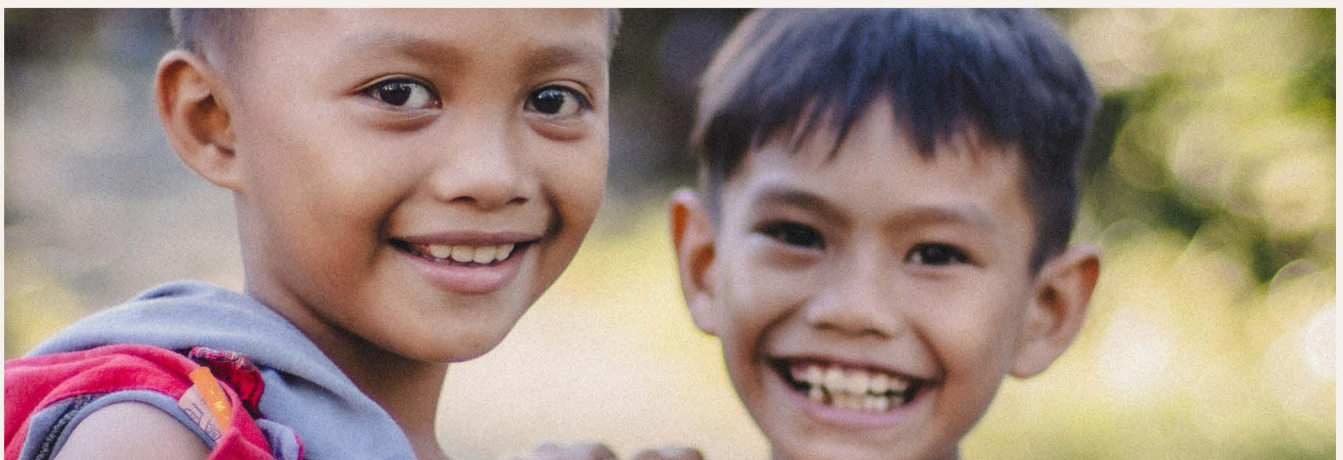
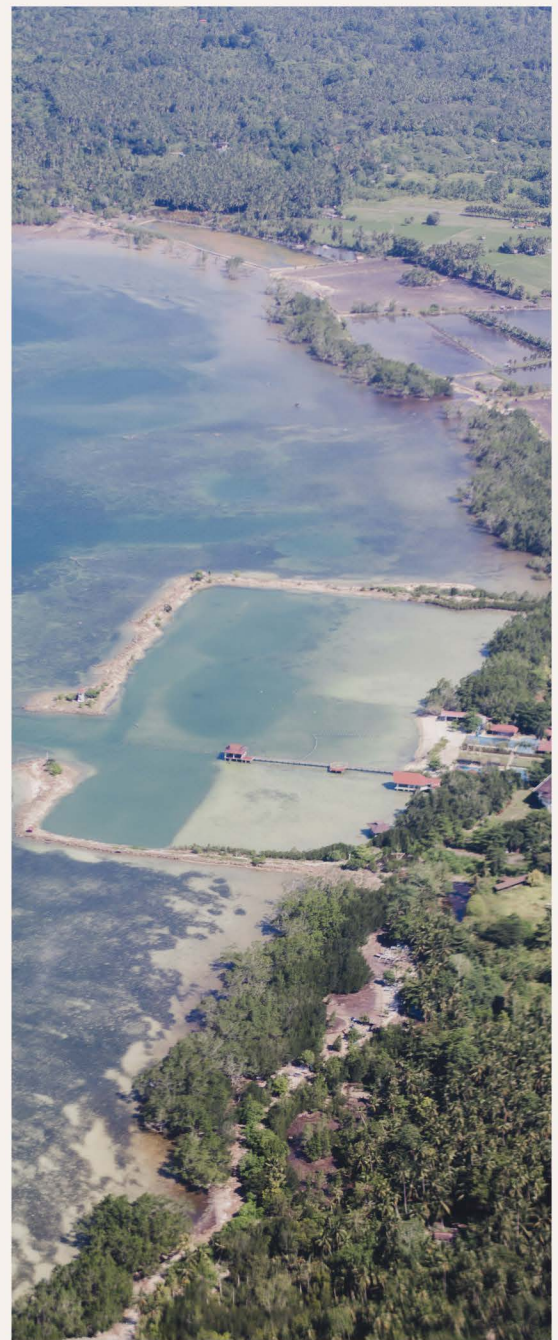


Greetings from Tennessee!

We are thrilled that you'll be joining us on this incredible journey to the Philippines! From the vibrant streets of Davao to remote jungle villages accessible only by river or trail, you'll encounter people whose faith, resilience, and hospitality will move you deeply.

This is more than a trip, this is a divine assignment. We believe the Lord has handpicked each of you for a specific purpose, and we're expectant to see how He will move, both through you and within you, during our time together.

This packet includes everything you need to know before we leave: travel logistics, packing lists, and a look at Far-Flung Tin Can's partnership with the incredible ministry of One Way Outreach in the Philippines.



Why the Philippines?

Since 2017, Far-Flung Tin Can has carried a growing burden for the Oceania region, sensing that God was opening doors across the islands of the Pacific. Over the years, that calling began to take shape as we met missionaries serving throughout the region, each encounter preparing us for the moment we met Pastor Ken Gaitano.

Pastor Ken shared the remarkable legacy of his family's ministry, One Way Outreach, founded on his grandfather's vision to plant a church on every island of the Philippines. His father carried that mantle, and now Ken continues that generational calling with passion and humility. Their story deeply resonated with our team.

In 2022, we traveled to Davao City to film their ministry and officially partner with One Way Outreach. What began as a documentary quickly grew into a powerful friendship and ongoing mission, one that connects hearts across oceans and generations.

What is One Way Outreach?

One Way Outreach is an international movement committed to the Great Commission. "One Way" stands for their unchanging message: Jesus is the only way (John 14:6).

"Outreach" represents their limitless mission: Go into all the world (Matthew 28:19–20).

Birthered from a vision and word of The Lord to Reverend Benjamin Gaitano Jr. in 1973, this ministry has now planted and operates over 1,000 churches in and throughout the country of the Philippines. One Way Outreach has impacted countless lives and communities. It is our honor to come alongside them to encourage, equip, and share in the work God is doing across these islands.

Nuts and Bolts

Every great adventure begins with preparation, and this packet will help you get ready for all that lies ahead. Read through each section carefully so you can begin preparing now, spiritually and practically, for what God has in store.





Packing Guidelines

Clothing

Pack comfortable clothes for ministry days that you don't mind getting a little dirty, as we'll be helping with hands-on projects. Also bring modest outfits for evening services. The weather will be warm and humid, with frequent rain, so pack light layers and quick-dry fabrics.

Additional Gear

You'll need waterproof hiking boots and a rain jacket, both essential for travel through remote or muddy areas. Electricity is not always reliable, especially in the villages. Bring a portable flashlight or headlamp, and a reusable water bottle to stay hydrated. A power bank is essential for charging your phone or camera when outlets aren't available.

Toiletries

Include all your personal care items (hair products, body wash, deodorant, etc.). A microfiber towel is recommended since shower access will vary by location. Body wipes are also useful for remote areas where running water isn't guaranteed.

Sun Protection

The tropical sun can be intense. Protect your skin and eyes as we'll spend long days outdoors in rural villages.

Bug Repellent

Whether it's spray, wipes, or bug bands, don't skip this one. We'll be in tropical environments where mosquitoes are plentiful.

Medicine

If you take daily medications, pack them in their original bottles with your name clearly labeled so there is no issue at the airport.

Passport

You literally can't go anywhere without it. Keep it safe and easily accessible, you'll need it every step of the way.

Money

Bring a small amount of spending money for souvenirs, snacks, or coffee during travel days. All other major expenses are covered.

Bible & Journal

Next to your passport, these are the most important items you'll bring. Expect God to speak to you deeply on this trip – write it down and treasure it. Come prepared and prayerful, don't leave your Sword behind.



Suggested Vaccinations

No vaccinations are required for entry into the Philippines, but we recommend updating the following for your safety:

+ Tetanus | + Hepatitis A & B

We're not medical professionals, so we suggest visiting a travel clinic for personalized guidance before departure.

Allergies

If you have any food, animal, or environmental allergies, PLEASE let us know BEFORE THE TRIP. This helps us plan meals, groceries and accommodations safely. Bring any required allergy medication or EpiPen in its original packaging with your name clearly marked.

Tentative Schedule

* Please note that the itinerary for this trip is subject to change due to weather conditions, the evolving needs of the people we serve, unforeseen circumstances, or the guidance of the Lord.

Day 1 & 2 Travel Days

Day 3 Land in Davao City Airport. Dinner then check into hotel and rest.

Day 4 Drive to the village of Marabatuan and minister there with children's ministry, home visits, and nightly services.

Day 5 Marabatuan Ministry

Day 6 Marabatuan Ministry

Day 7 Leave Marabatuan for Davao City and Tagum.

Day 8 Church services in different locations in Davao city and Tagum City.

Day 9 Visit, Minister, and stay in newly evangelized village of Umayam.

Day 10 Leave Umayam for Davao City.

Day 11 & 12 Travel Days Home.
